UNITED WAY OF NORTHEAST ARKANSAS DIRECTED PROGRAMS



Through the IRS VITA program, we offer one path to financial stability for low to middle income families and individuals. IRS certified volunteers file income tax returns at no charge, with emphasis on claiming the Earned Income Tax Credit. This credit can make a significant difference to a family; helping reduce debt or saving for a "rainy day."



Hundreds of area pre-k children receive a free book every month by mail across Northeast Arkansas. Studies show that reading to your child early and regularly helps them be ready to learn. As the administrator for Imagination Library for Northeast Arkansas, United Way uses donor funds and seeks grants to enroll as many children as possible to help them be ready for kindergarten.



We have collected thousands of packages of school supplies for local children. Supplies are collected in seven counties at eight Walmart stores to help more than 20 school districts across Northeast Arkansas. All supplies collected during the one day event go directly to participating schools to be used by students and teachers.



Since 1994, local businesses have joined hands and hearts for what is now the largest community service project day in the area! Each year hundreds of volunteers complete service projects, making a difference in the lives of local citizens and the heart of each volunteer.

UNITED WAY COLLABORATIONS



United Way of NEA serves as the administrator of EFSP in Craighead County as well as serving on the EFSP boards in Greene and Poinsett counties. The federally-funded FEMA program supplements the work of local social service organizations to provide shelter, food and supportive services to individuals and families who have economic emergencies.



Following the 2017 floods along the Black River, community leaders formed the Randolph County Recovery Committee to address immediate needs of victims and to establish an ongoing fund to help those with disasters. United Way of NEA serves as fiduciary of RCRC.



A-State United Way is an on-campus organization for students attending Arkansas State University. In partnership with Volunteer A-State and the Leadership Office, students are able to raise funds for United Way and hold service projects while learning more about United Way.
